

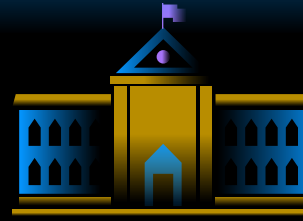
### 1. Top threats

Data privacy and cybersecurity regulations are on the rise worldwide to face attacks against critical infrastructure and record-breaking data leaks.



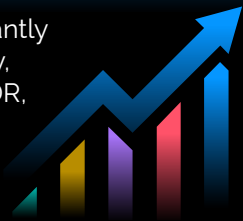
### 3. CISO's agenda

SASE will put the security stack at the edge of the cloud - where the data and users are in digital workplace.



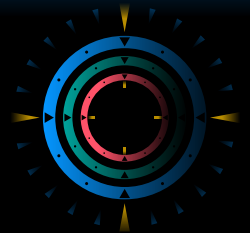
### 7. Future of DevSecOps

A shift towards the edge, automation, and simplification will be front and center in improving your security posture.



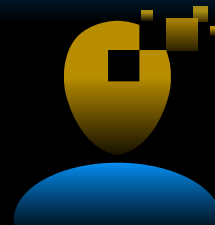
### 9. Industry challenges
